A.A. Graduation Rate	The rate reflects the percentage of students who started the program in the year 2016-2017 and completed in 4 years or less. The group includes 1 st year and transfer students who declared their major within the 2016-2017 year. Associate’s Degree graduation rates include associate-seeking students who received a Bachelor’s degree within the time period, as well. Students who switched majors but graduated from Chaminade count against this rate, as do students who did not graduate from Chaminade.
B.A. Graduation Rate	The rate reflects the percentage of students who started the program in the 2014-2015 year and completed in 6 years or less. The group includes 1 st year and transfer students who declared their major within the 2014-2015 year. Students who switched

	majors but graduated from Chaminade count against this rate, as do students who did not graduate from Chaminade.
B.S. Graduation Rate	The rate reflects the percentage of students who started the program in the 2015-2016 year and completed in 6 years or less. The group includes 1 st year and transfer students who declared their major within the 2015-2016 year. Students who switched majors but graduated from Chaminade count against this rate, as do students who did not graduate from Chaminade.
MBA Graduation Rate	The rate for each MBA program reflects the percentage of students who started the program in the 2016-2017 year and completed in 4 years or less. The rate does not account for students who switched concentrations. For example, if a student was declared with an Accounting concentration and switched to and graduated as a general MBA, that counts against the Accounting MBA graduation rate but not for the General MBA.
